On 9th February 2014, a CME on LEGAL PROBLEMS IN MEDICAL PROFESSION-2014 was conducted in Mandya Institute of Medical sciences, Mandya by Department of Forensic Medicine.

The dignitaries and the guest speakers arrived for the inauguration function by 9:00 am. The Programme was inaugurated by the Chief guest Shri. Chandrashekar Patil, Honorable Principal District & Session Judge. The programme was presided by Dr. Pushpa Sarkar, Director, MIMS, Mandya. And the guests of Honor were Dr. S.M. . This was followed by lamp lighting ceremony. Dr Pushpa Sarkar, the Director of this institution, then addressed the gathering wherein she emphasised the need to know Legal Problems in Medical Profession, Consumer Protection Act & its implications on Medical Profession. The organizing secretary, Dr Ashwini Narayan K, then delivered the Vote of Thanks.

A pre-CME evaluation test was conducted to the delegates. Completed forms were collected after 15 mins. Consequently the first scientific session was started by Dr. Somasekharaiah D, Prof of Paediatric Surgery and Former member, Karnataka Medical Council. Dr. Somasekharaiah D spoke on "Medical Ethics and Etiquette". He stated about Code of Medical Ethics of Medical Council of India. He emphasised on the fact of need of effective practicing of Medical ethics.

The second scientific session was by Dr. S.M. Kantikar, who spoke about 'Consumer Protection Act and Medical Profession—An Overview'. Dr. S.M.

Kantikar spoke about bare act and case laws. He also spoke about recent judgements of Honorable Courts. This was followed by Tea break for 15 mins.

The pre-lunch scientific session was started by Shri. Basaviah, Senior Advocate, Mandya. Shri. Basaviah spoke about the "Laws relating to protection of the medical professionals with special reference to the 'Karnataka Prohibition of Violence against Medicare Service Personnel and Damage to Property in Medicare Service Institutions Act, 2009'".



This session was followed by lunch for 45 mins. The post-CME evaluation form was handed over to the delegates after lunch. The scientific sessions were then resumed at 2:45 pm. The next session was by Dr. K.W.D.Ravichandar, Professor and HOD, Dept of Forensic Medicine, MIMS, Mandya, who spoke about Practical problems in Medicolegal Autopsies.

The last session was by Dr. Shubhakar Karra Paul, Forensic Physician and Sexual Assault Examiner, West Yorkshire, U.K., who spoke about Medical Negligence -Global Scenario.

This Scientific session was followed by Panel Discussion, which was moderated by Dr. Ashwini Narayan K. And the panelists were Dr. Somasekharaiah D, Prof of Paediatric Surgery and Former member of Karnataka Medical Council joined the CME programme as a panellist along with Dr. K.W.D.Ravichandar, Professor and HOD, Dept of Forensic Medicine, Dr. Shubhakar Karra Paul, Forensic Physician and Sexual Assault Examiner, West Yorkshire, and Shri. Basaviah, Senior Advocate, Mandya. Topics related to Medical Negligence and problems while dealing with Medicolegal autopsies were discussed. The post CME Evaluation forms and the feedback forms were collected from the delegates.

Vote of thanks was then delivered by Dr. Ashwini Narayan K and all the dignitaries, guest speakers, faculty members, delegates, non-teaching and technical staffs were thanked for making this CME programme successful.
